God is doing great things here in Prescott, Arizona!

As we are now more than halfway through a year that has been full of twists and turns, we are rejoicing to know that God is in control.

During a recent sermon Pastor Jessie Morales reminded the congregation about a word from God that was given at the January Bible Conference in Prescott by Pastor Paul Stephens. "The next six months were going to be like nothing we had seen before." He also spoke about "Supernatural power, supernatural healing, supernatural crowds and supernatural money in these last days. The revival we all have been longing to see, God was going to deposit in unprecedented ways."

Truly these have been unprecedented times, but nevertheless we are continuing to see the supernatural hand of God move in mighty ways.

July Bible conference here in Prescott had the supernatural favor of God on it. Just one week before the conference was set to be held, the governor of Arizona passed a ban on gatherings greater than 50 people. Although this is not ideally how we would have chosen to hold our conference, this led to the first Prescott conference in which we were unable to all gather together. However, the work of God was still accomplished as the regular preaching schedule with full services was broadcast worldwide on Livestream.

As we all viewed conference via Livestream, it was such an encouragement to hear victory reports from our churches out in the Harvest field.

Thursday International Night was no different than any other conference as we saw eight exciting brand new churches planted internationally. Friday evening ended with another 16 domestic pioneer works planted.

The Gospel is still being proclaimed, and the spirit of pioneering is still the focus of our Fellowship, even in these unprecedented times. Three couples were launched out of the Prescott congregation from this past July conference. Andy and Carrie Rosas are beginning a work for God in Tampa, Florida; Ian and Priscilla Kline are going to pioneer in Fort Wayne, Indiana; and Adrian and Emily Martinez are preparing to start a new work for God in Tahiti.

We are thrilled to see what God is going to accomplish through these willing hearts.

Our local outreaches were put on hold for a time, but have now started up again as Covid restrictions have eased. Our first Saturday morning outreach back was a powerful time, with more than 40 faithful saints showing up to participate. In that outreach alone 19 people gave their lives to Christ! Disciples in our church were stirred to pray for the sick and step out in faith. We saw two miracles that morning, one of which was a young lady who had scoliosis and God came down and visibly healed her body!

We also have had the opportunity to hold outreaches at a local park, where many families regularly gather. During the first out-

reach we held, our youth band set up and performed, drawing a crowd of teens and families with more than 100 visitors coming out to the event. Through personal testimonies and one-on-one evangelism 15 people were saved, then seven more answered the altar call at the end of the night.

Every Friday evening we've been gathering at the church for a Tri-City Evangelism Night. One of our disciples shares a brief message on evangelism and then we all head out, encouraged and eager to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Although we are currently unable to witness door to door, we have had great favor in going to neighborhood parks and local grocery store parking lots. So even though these are truly unprecedented times, this has still been a fruitful time of evangelism for our congregation.

We look forward to great things ahead, both as a congregation and a fellowship.

There is a stirring in our hearts as we all look in anticipation to the return of Christ, which grows ever nearer. We give God the praise for every soul saved, and every opportunity be a part of the work He has established. Pray for our church and our Fellowship, and specifically for our headship.

ing week and received the news that she was four weeks pregnant when we had only gone there three weeks ago! The doctor himself couldn't say it was because of anything he had





David Bergsland

Igrew up religious as an Episcopalian. I was an acolyte, active in the choir, youth group and knew all the doctrine. When I graduated from high school, I left church because there was nothing relevant there. It had nothing to do with my life.

The Air Force was a required step to avoid the draft in 1963, and I hated it. Finally in 1965, I acted crazy enough to convince the base shrink that I really needed to get out of the military. Somehow I got an honorable discharge.

In 1967, I dropped out, was turned on to grass and LSD. I started the first psychedelic acid rock group in Minneapolis. We weren't much good, just first. We'd take acid to blow our minds wide open, and then spend six hours or so making ourselves better [or so we thought].

I went back to college at the University of Minnesota the fall of 1967, majoring in painting and drawing with minors in printmaking and art history. I also started pursuing every avenue of the occult I ran across. I was an enemy of the church.

My normal practice was to get completely involved in the latest area of interest and run my life by the precepts and practices of the belief system that currently had my attention.

In all of these areas, I eventually discovered that the next step was to get a personal spirit guide. I was never willing to do that. I had no reason to avoid this. In hindsight, it has become apparent that I was protected in all of this by my father's prayers as I wandered in spiritual danger rebelling from the church of my youth.

My father had a radical rebirth and baptism in the Holy Spirit in the late 1950s and early 1960s. He was one of the first Episcopal clergy to get filled with the Spirit.

By the late 1960s, my father had really worked hard to make a relationship with me. He and I had been in countless debates about all of this. I could see that he had something that worked for him. I was happy for him, but I didn't see Jesus as a viable alternative for me.

As the debates became more like arguments, my dad wisely pulled

back after making me promise to never quit seeking until I was convinced that I had found absolute truth.

Toward the end of 1973 I moved into a cold-water storefront next to a rough bar in the Indian (primarily Sioux) ghetto in south Minneapolis just outside the hippie area of the West Bank.

For the next couple of months, my life got worse and worse. I was living on one large pancake a day, dry, filled with sunflower seeds and raisins. I couldn't afford more than that. I could barely pay the \$45 a month rent. Needless to say, my art wasn't selling well down in that area.

I got all the drugs I needed from my friends. I was smoking pot every two hours as I had for the past seven years. I was dropping acid (LSD) once or twice a week. I had hundreds of acid trips by this time.

Somehow, in my drugged stupor, I called my dad and said, "I need to get filled with the spirit." I had no idea what that meant and as far as I know I had never heard that term before.

My father came over and bundled me in the car and took me to his Bible study. They all laid hands on me. I renounced the world, the flesh and the devil. They got me to ask Jesus to be my savior and Lord. They prayed that I would be filled with the Holy Spirit in power. To me, it was the same thing I did with all my occult efforts. I gave Jesus six months to prove himself.

I felt nothing. I was too stoned. I kept doing my drugs. The first indication that something had changed was the note on my wall calendar/journal a couple days later that "I feel strangely peaceful." I didn't realize I'd met the Lord Jesus for quite a while. But the transformation by the summer of 1974 was truly astounding. I am not the same man I was - thank God!

In February of 1974 I actually started working again. By March I had gotten hired as a cook downtown. Walking home from work, I was praying and singing like I always did. My songs changed to an unknown language and became worship. I had received tongues. I never

did have an emotional experience of conversion. But I'd met the Lord Jesus. I surrendered completely to my Lord.

What a ride it's been since then! I met my wife at one of the groups. Pat and I had a wonderful life of ministry, pioneering two churches, and many other things. But late in life, physical problems forced us to close the church and by the time we moved to Rochester in 2018, my wife could not walk and was in a chair. We looked, but we could find no one preaching the Gospel.

Finally, we gave up and told the Lord, "If you want us to go to a church, send someone to the door who preaches the Gospel." Shortly afterward, Pastor Paul came to the door. I stopped him and asked, "You preach the Gospel?" He said he did, and convinced me quickly he was telling the truth. I dragged him inside and introduced him to my wife. We started going to Greece Potter's House. It became our church home.

Now that my wife has died, I'm grateful for the love and support - and hearing the Gospel preached.

Hello From Kathmandu, Nepal. I would like to give a report about some of the wonderful miracles of provision that God has given us during this time of coronavirus restriction and lockdown.

In Nepal a typical household will earn around \$200 to \$250 per month. Many of our people work jobs that depend on them working full time six days a week to meet their duty to acquire such a salary.

Many in this church, however, have risen to the challenge of giving faithfully not only before the lockdown, but even during this period of time. We have been hearing great reports of God's blessing upon those who have obeyed God.

One couple who was in a lot of financial pressure and debt rose to a specific challenge that was given in our church, and they have seen almost all of that debt paid off.

Another couple spent most of their time in the village during the lockdown. When they returned to Kathmandu, much of their work had been cut back. The husband who worked at an automobile dealership went back to

work about half the time, and during the four months of lockdown the limited staff that had been working had not sold even one vehicle. God helped him tremendously though, as after only a couple of weeks back to work, he had sold two vehicles and had another two ready to sell. Needless to say his bosses were very happy to have him back, and he has received tremendous favor.

Right before the lockdown started in March, I was able to go to a neurological hospital to pray for a young man who had been in a motorcycle accident. He was in a coma when I prayed for him, and the situation did not appear to be hopeful. Having no direct contact with the family, I was unsure of the initial response.
